

Dear Friends

Is it my imagination or does Christmas start earlier each year? Compiling these thoughts shortly after Bonfire Night, it seems somewhat premature to be thinking about Christmas. However the night sky being spectacularly illuminated by cascading fireworks seems to create parallels when reflecting about Christmas.

One of the favourite Old Testament passages used at Christmas is from the prophet Isaiah, 9, where we find the words, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light, those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shined." Indeed in the very narratives of the human birth of Jesus how often is reference made to light. Think of the shepherds on the hillside, or the magi led by the shining star. Jesus described himself as "the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." John 8v12

The fireworks are amazing yet transitory, after exploding their myriad designs in a kaleidoscope of colours they fade and the darkness returns. Christians believe that the events of Christmas hold significance all year, as John's Gospel puts it, "The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness has never put it out..." John 1v5 Personally I find that deeply reassuring especially as we continue to journey through these strange times. Let us remember that into the darkness Christ came as a light, giving hope and a promise of joy both now and to come.

As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birthday may God's love surround you and may we, in turn, express something of the light of his love by our little and large deeds of kindness to those we meet on life's journey especially during this time of pandemic. That smile, that comforting word of encouragement that generous act can make a difference. We don't always see the results of our caring, but in the words of an Indian Proverb, 'All the flowers of all the tomorrows are in the seeds of today'

May you and your families and friends have a safe, peaceful and happy time this Christmas and be richly blessed as we likewise journey through Advent and then into the New Year.



CHRISTMAS SHOEBOXES

Thanks to the donations from many people and to Brenda's hard work and willingness to give up a room in her house for many months, it has been possible to pack 85 shoeboxes. These were collected by Rich Parsons from Foundation for Social Change and Inclusion (FSCI) on 16th November. Rich has told us that they have now taken the decision to extend the appeal. Sorting and checking will take place in January, and distributions will move to end of Feb. He says it's a real pity they can't get the boxes out for Christmas, but they can't commit under the conditions. The boxes will arrive in Bulgaria in time for their Liberation Day celebrations (Mar 3rd), which are a big thing there. We were also able to give £100 donated by church friends to which the church added sufficient to transport all the boxes. Before the boxes were collected Rev David went to Brenda's house to say a prayer of blessing for the boxes, may it be the prayer of us all:

Loving God, we pray for your blessing on these shoeboxes and pray that each item contained in all these boxes will be blessed.

Loving God, we ask for your blessing.

We pray for the hurting children and adults who will receive these boxes and the contents we've packed with love.

Loving God, we pray for your touch of compassion.

We pray for children and families who are suffering in the desperate circumstances of poverty, sickness or war, that you will be so close to them.

Loving God, we pray for your bounty.

We pray that through these shoeboxes the hearts and minds of those who receive them may be opened to your love and the message of your grace through Jesus Christ who came amongst us as a vulnerable babe at Bethlehem.

Loving God, we pray for your love to be manifest.

We pray, also for all those who are participating in some way in the shoebox appeal and for the process of collecting, processing, transporting and delivering of the boxes to their destinations.

Loving God, we ask for your blessing. Amen.

Brenda was given flowers from the church for her dedicated work throughout the year and enabling these gifts to still be sent in this difficult time.

CTW CHRISTIAN AID REPORT FOR 2020

Christian Aid week 2020 did not, of course, take place in Warminster during May as planned.

At the end of last year, it was decided to repeat last year's plan of asking each church in the Churches Together group to pledge to raise at least £600 for Christian Aid 2020.

In normal years the charity's fund raising is sufficient to send money for a Christmas party and other treats for the children and families but this year many of the usual fund raising events could not happen, They are therefore appealing for donations towards these bags. They estimate that £25 per bag is needed.

UPDATE FOR THE AREA'S NEW SEND A COW PROJECT "Women of Migori".

The team in Kenya started the project on 9th September, the project goal is to reduce poverty levels and build sustainable livelihoods of 9000 households! They have already identified two unprotected water springs (unclean water sources) which they plan to work on. Making sure communities have clean water is one of Send a Cow's priorities. The team have already started training the farmers and have provided follow up visits to the farms. There is a great sense of expectancy as families learn new skills and are hopeful of growing food on their own land. MODERN SLAVERY

I was astonished to learn that slavery is happening in Wiltshire. Because we are a rural community slave masters are moving people into this area to work in debt and live in bondage.

A few members from our Churches Together in Warminster have found out (through a reputable, nationwide anti-slavery training course), that this can be combated: not through challenging slave masters! but through recognising the 'signs' and reporting the circumstances to professional investigators including Crime Stoppers and the Police.

Reporting can be done anonymously. Churches in UK are asked to be involved because of the variety of people who come through our doors. We may be able to publicise support phone numbers that will enable an endangered individual to get help, we may be able to befriend people who have escaped dire circumstances and or offer ourselves as a caring community to surround them while they take a deep breath of freedom.

In the new year I will give more information about how we can safely become involved as individuals or as a church. Meanwhile, Churches Together is supporting this endeavour. Please pray for these people: children, teenagers, women and men, the elderly, people with learning difficulties, migrants and the vulnerable who have become victims and don't yet know how to get free.
