It seems that during the last year we have had too many Good Friday's. In these days of darkness during the Covid-19 world epidemic, we are reminded of how precious life can be and how vulnerable we all are as human beings.

As we see and hear the grim statistics of infection rates and deaths, we recall that each number is a human being with loved ones and friends. The suffering and death from Covid stare us in the face. Churches Together in Warminster have suggested that, as this year most of us will be unable to gather to remember and celebrate the Easter story in our churches, all the churches in town produce a display showing any or all of the four special days of Easter. (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday).

Posters have been bought for our church windows and a large plain cross will also be put in the window. People are asked to make flowers that can be attached to the cross for Easter Sunday. Flowers can be made from any material and should be no more than A5 size. Please pop them in the church letter box (on the wall to the left of the front door) no



later than Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> April, or post to the church's address (Warminster United Church, George St, Warminster BA12 8DH). Penelope will be attaching the flowers to the cross on the Saturday. If your daily exercise walk can take you past the church, and others in the town, do have a look!

On Good Friday a man will be walking through our town carrying a cross. Would you take his photo if you see him and post it on Facebook and send it to the Journal so that people know that our town is remembering Good Friday.

CTW are also contacting the schools to see if they will be able (with everything else they have to do) to encourage the children to produce something beautiful for Easter. (paintings, Easter Gardens, collages)

Churches Together will offer palm crosses to every school.

They have asked them to send their art work into the Journal - whether it is at their homes or at their school.

When I went travelling to Synod with him, we went for a cup of tea and he lit up a cigarette. I was so surprised. I hadn't seen a man smoke for years! He said he found it broke the ice a lot when he went to visit people from outside the church and he could stand around and have a cigarette alongside the men after a funeral or wedding. It helped people relax in his company when they realised he was just an ordinary man. We found him to be extraordinary. "

understandably, not receiving many boxes but asks that everyone remembers to keep any boxes when they do buy new shoes and give them to her when circumstances allow. She will also be happy to receive any items that anyone makes or buys to go in boxes and store away until the autumn Many thanks.

Meanwhile we have received the following message from Rich Parsons, who is the operational manager responsible for shipping the boxes:

"The boxes (collected last November) are still in the UK at the moment, but we hope to get them out in time for Easter in Bulgaria.

Things have been complicated because the authorities in Bulgaria don't seem to have been ready to deal with Humanitarian Aid (HA) from the UK post Brexit. We are basically waiting for them to give us leave to import HA without attracting the fees and taxes that would be attached to a commercial load. We obviously want to avoid paying these, so it is good that the Bulgarian government is working to sort the process.

Feedback from the Bulgarian Ministry of Labour is positive so far, and, all being well, we shall hear next week that we can ship the Christmas boxes.

We will update you when things are moving again

#### RECYCLING I.T. EQUIPMENT

I recently attended a Sustainable Warminster meeting to hear Simon talk about a company based in Chitterne and was very impressed. The message below is being shared so that should you have any pieces of electrical equipment which can be used, please consider recycling. I will act as our drop off location or you can drop things off at Kingdown school. What surprised me the most was the amount of kettle leads about, which can be recycled; taking the copper out of the wires, recycled in to useable tonnage and then shipped back to China to start all over again!!

"Have you any IT equipment you no longer need or no longer use? We are working in collaboration with a company based in Chitterne (Blackmore Ricotech). They are specialists who perform Licensed Data Wiping, Re-purposing and Re-cycling of IT equipment with a view to donating back to the community (specially laptops, tablets and phones) to those who are in need - both the young and the elderly. Of course, with the current Covid situation and people working and learning from home, the digital divide is even greater.

The advantage of working with Blackmore is that they have a zero to landfill policy which interests us greatly - everything is recycled."


