

Dear Friends

Compiling these thoughts next to a scented candle I cannot but keep watching the flame. For me there is something powerful about a candle flame, symbolising light in the darkness and let us be honest there remains far too much darkness within the still present horror that is Covid.



Many will be familiar with William Holman Hunt's painting, *The Light of the World* representing the figure of Jesus preparing to knock on an overgrown and long-unopened door. Those words from John 8 are probably the best-known reference to light in the Gospels and particularly in the here and now of where we find ourselves it is important to be reminded that no matter how bleak or difficult or frightening the world might appear, Christ is the light of the world and the darkness shall not overcome it! However, Jesus challenges us to be light bearers: "you are the light of the world, don't hide that light under a basket but rather put it on a stand so the whole house can see." (Matthew 5v14-16). Now that is the question: How might you let

God's light shine through you to others? And then very poignantly in what ways have you hidden God's light under a basket in your life?

One of my favourite contemporary hymns is by Bernadette Farrell with the rousing chorus:

**Christ, be our Light!
Shine in our hearts.
Shine through the darkness.
Christ, be our light!
Shine in your Church gathered today.**

As we approach Advent, journey into Christmas and likewise Epiphany and the New Year may we celebrate the Light that is Christ who comes among us to be one with us. May we likewise be one with him and shine forth his light to a world so desperately in need.

Dear Everyone

This letter is being read to the congregations of each of the four churches in the section, it comes as always with my gratitude for all that you do in the life of the church and the assurance of my continuing prayers.

You will be aware that I am involved one day a week in hospital chaplaincy, what you may not know is how many times I have been asked to become full-time. After much thought and discernment, I have accepted a permanent hospital chaplaincy post within the NHS based at Taunton. Permission to accept this has been granted by the national Methodist Church.

This means that I will leaving Wiltshire in the latter part of January. It has meant so much to share in ministry with everyone since September 2012 – over 9 years ago, thank you for allowing me that privilege. The Area Executive will be arranging ministerial cover for each church.

I look forward very much to sharing in Advent and Christmas with you and likewise leading us into the New Year as we hold our Covenant Services.

CHURCH COUNCIL

At the Full Church meeting in October the new Church Council (Trustees) were appointed as below:

To serve for 3 years: John Alpin, Erica Castle, Karen Woollard and Anita Silk

To serve for 1 year: Marion Barton, Marion Hornby, Mary Treadwell, Joan Jones, Joan Stephens and Margaret Edwards.

At the first church council meeting Karen took on the post of Church Secretary, which John had held for around 40 years! Hilary Reynolds stepped down as Treasurer, having held the post for 14 years, her successor has not been confirmed but Anita is considering taking on the role. Many thanks to John and Hilary for their long service. These are the 2 roles that have to have a named person. Other tasks and duties were taken on by various council members.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN WARMINSTER - Reports from our Joint Projects

Christian Aid – a difficult year but we raised £4,091.80 including a sponsored walk from a member.

Food Bank. Jean Colgrave is leading now. If a person needs food, they can phone Food Bank number and delivery will be arranged or food can be collected.

Cornerstone – the office reception has been open for a few months now. We are seeing a lot of need (homeless, second language speakers, form filling, phoning on behalf). We are well funded but we need more volunteers. The Social Prescribers at the Avenue Surgery has been an excellent link. Marion Barton has set up the Chat Cafe which is very valuable.

Street Pastors – every Friday night in the town and Sunday afternoons in the park area– this is a very effective service to the community where loving, spiritual conversations take place on the Streets but we are very short of volunteers. (Friday night 10pm meet at Baptist Church and the Pastors stay till the last train leaves Warminster, 3am ish). There is training available for new volunteers.

Refugee Support – Three families had settled in Warminster. Now members are supporting Westbury, because there is a housing shortage in Warminster. It was a very nice initiative and we learnt a lot through it. If anyone knows of a house that could be for rent in Warminster, please get in touch so that another family can be homed. Have you got bikes for kids and one for an adult male (for the Westbury family).

Youth Work – this is being done in individual churches now. Talk for Warminster School every Monday morning as Chaplain and pastoral work is being done by Christ Church with the boarders. A lot of the primary schools are church schools. The clergy and Open the Book teams do collective worship in schools. A lot of resources (e.g. digital prayer maps) are offered to the schools because the children do not come into church. The ministry has to go to where the children are. Relationships with the schools and the children need to be developed so that the Message of God's love can be shared successfully. Open the Book was Zoomed into Princetown during Covid and the staff are attending now. Rev Mags Collings is heading up the Mentoring Scheme in Kingdown School.

Against Modern Slavery – We have connected with the police and Salvation Army looking at the prevalence of exploitation and county lines in our rural community. Leaflets were distributed to be shared with congregations to raise awareness and give the Crimestoppers number so anyone can report anything that doesn't look right.
